

Lincoln High School Hall of Fame

History

The Lincoln High School Hall-of-Fame got its start on May 8, 2001. On that date a meeting was held with the following persons present: Judy Busch, Bob Carlson, Don Decker, Orin Ellwein, Floyd Farrand, Lolly Forseth, Rich Greeno, Steve Munro, and Phyllis Schragg. Prior to this meeting Floyd Farrand made a presentation to the Lincoln High School Booster Club requesting them to underwrite the initial expenses of a Hall of Fame. This group met monthly with the intent of drafting a constitution and by-laws as well as picking a permanent Hall of Fame committee. The constitution and by-laws were drafted and a permanent committee was chosen with their first meeting being held on October 15, 2001. The first Hall of Fame committee consisted of the following members: co-chairs, Lolly Forseth, Steve Munro, secretary, Judy Busch, treasurer, Deb Wallenberg, general members, Rosella Blunk, Orin Ellwein, Rich Greeno, John Landegent, Jerry Miller, Craig Sharpe, and Carl Swanson.

Purpose

The purpose of the Lincoln High School Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor former members of the staff, administration, athletics, fine arts, and student body, and community-wide contributors for their outstanding achievements and/or contributions to Lincoln High School.

Duties of Hall of Fame Committee:

1. Publish the purpose and criteria for awards.
2. Gather nominations through alumni, media and other sources.
3. Select inductees each year for the Hall of Fame.
4. Determine the number of inductees for each year.

Induction Categories are as follows:

1. Former Student – five (5) or more years out of Lincoln High School.*
2. Former Staff – three (3) or more years out of Lincoln High School.*
3. Current or Former Community Persons and or Organizations.*

*Those who have made a significant contribution to one or more of the following areas – Academics, Athletics, Fine Arts.
